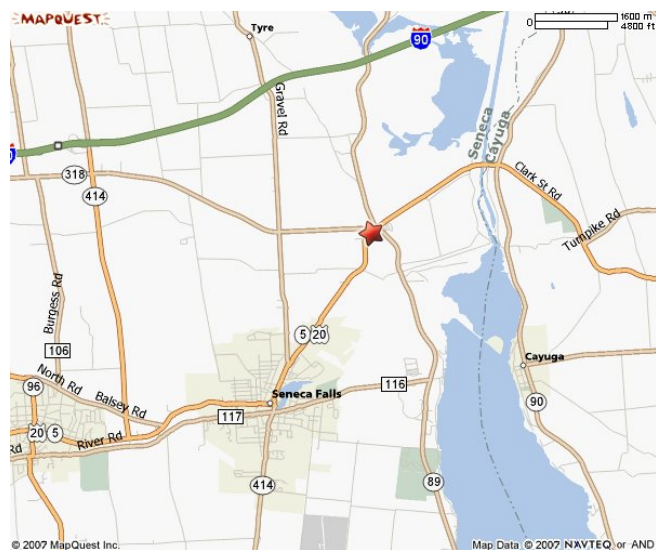

For just \$25 you will be rewarded with interesting speakers, lunch, handouts and free seeds.

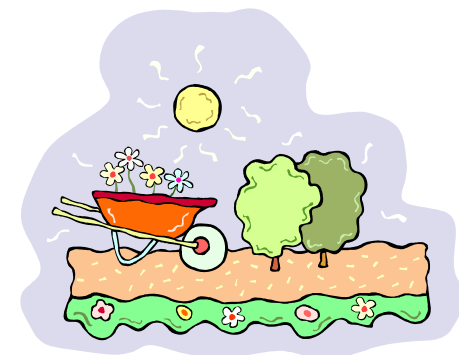
